



Activity: Using Webbing to Form Edges

Often the object being encapsulated has a very irregular shape. Wrapping irregular shapes uses more plastic film and takes a lot longer to do. By using webbing tied points on the object that protrude and then tensioning the web between the points, a more regular shape can be created that makes the wrapping task much easier.



Use the webbing shown above. This plastic-based webbing is strong (900Kg breaking strain) and does not "catch" to the plastic during shrinking. Under-Raps sells the items shown above, see the Under-Raps catalogue for details.
